This forum will bring together a panel of experts in autism, communications, pediatrics, surveillance, and survey research to discuss the underlying motivations behind immunizing children, national surveillance activities to track progress, and novel approaches to gather immunization data.

This panel will discuss key questions such as:

- What influences the public's perceptions of vaccination?
- How are immunization data collected and analyzed?
- What are current trends in vaccination?
- How are other aspects of care influenced by vaccine choices?
